Do you have Gary Public Library materials that are overdue? How about canned goods or other non-perishable food items you are willing to donate? Well, the Gary Public Library plans to promote a special amnesty period, Food for Fines, beginning May 1.

What is amnesty? Amnesty refers to a specific time when patrons may return forgotten or overdue library materials - fine free!

While amnesty does not apply to lost materials, this is a great time to erase eligible fines, clear blocked borrowing privileges, replace lost library cards or renew them. Remember, fines increased in January, so this is a great time for you to return those overdue materials, no matter how overdue they are, and help give back to the community at the same time.

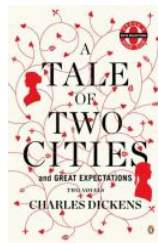

Free Computer Classes

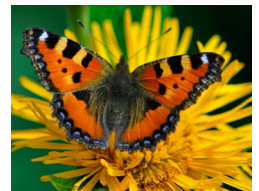
Registration has begun for free computer classes for adults at the Main Library, now through June. Class size is limited for all classes and registration is required.
